to do with your family this holiday season

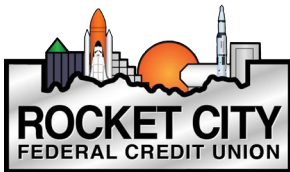
Create your own costume! Have fun and be creative, you can get online with your parents and look for ideas or come up with your own!
