IST CAR MAINTENANCE

Whether you have a couple years left before you hit the roads, or you're already in your first car, having some basic car maintenance knowledge may help you avoid costly repairs in the future.

New Car Warranty. If your first car is new, it is probably under warranty, meaning mechanical problems can be fixed at no charge to you, but it may not include routine maintenance, such as changing worn brake pads.

Oil Change & Tire Rotation. Some of the routine care your car needs includes regular oil changes and tire rotations. Keep an eye on your mileage to make sure you don't wait too long in between changes. Most places that change oil will also check your filters and let you know when it's time for a tire rotation. If they don't mention it during the oil change, you can always ask.

Tires. Keep an eye on the tread. An easy way to tell if you have enough tread is to use the penny test. Stick a penny upside down in the tread. If you can see Lincoln's entire head, it may be time for new tires.

Warning Lights. If a warning light comes on in your dash, figure out why. If you don't know what it means, you should be able to find out in your owner's manual.

Insurance. Always keep a copy of your insurance in your glove box. In the unfortunate event you get into a minor accident, be sure you get the insurance information of the other driver involved.

And finally, ALWAYS be safe and responsible while driving! Avoid tickets by wearing your seat belt and not driving too fast! Being a safe and careful driver is one of the best ways to avoid costly expenses!
